Student's personal supplies

- tracing paper
- scissors
- glue stick
- flat nose plier
- Hand files, needle files
- Sanding sticks
- Sand paper (220, 400, 600)
- Fine Scotch Brite pads
- Sanding sponges - 3M assortment pack or fine (320), ultrafine (600) and microfine (1000) at City Mill
- Pair of utility pliers
- Empty can
- Old towel
- Sharpie
- Pitch Bowl, 5" Pitch Bowl Kit (include red pitch) from Otto Frei sounds good!

- If you want to make a bigger art piece than 6" Diameter, then you need to get a bigger pitch bowl. I used rice bowl shaped cast iron Japanese incense bowl that I found at the Punahou festival at 2 dollars.
- Red Pitch if you do not buy the kit, buy 2 kilos of red German pitch
Part No.125.389 from Otto Frei
Chasing hammer: flat head chasing hammer with 1 1/8" to 1 1/4" face
- Copper or Sterling Silver: 22 Gauge metal sheet. The size should be all up to you but you need to add 3/4" on the actual size of the metal all around
- Plaster of Paris for pitch bowl
- Masks
- Disposable rubber Gloves
- steel bars to make chasing tools (students buy them from instructor)
